Letter from Executive Director

Dear Friends,

As I reflect on the past year, three words come to mind: inspiring, challenging, and grateful.

INSPIRING. It has been inspiring to watch the impact of the #MeToo Movement. Who knew a hashtag could have so much power and launch a national movement? The #MeToo Movement encouraged thousands of women — and some men — to speak up and share their stories. Many survivors felt believed, empowered, and less alone as badly-behaved men were finally held accountable for their actions.

The #MeToo Movement has also prompted conversations and inspired the creation of educational programs and policies to combat sexual harassment and violence. The Coalition's work with colleges and universities throughout the state has increased staff training, improved sexual assault policies, and enhanced bystander intervention programs on college campuses. By assisting law enforcement agencies to adopt and implement Tennessee's model sexual assault policy, we are improving the way officers are responding to victims of sexual violence. Our partnership with the Tennessee Titans has enhanced player education and changed the team's recruiting policies. More survivors are reporting their assaults to law enforcement and on college campuses. The attitudes of athletes, students, and school administrators are changing. In a short amount of time, we have seen the inspiring impact of our work.

CHALLENGING. We have also faced challenges over this past year. One of those challenges was changes to federal immigration policy that impact immigrant victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and trafficking. To address the growing fear among immigrant survivors, our staff held a community forum to increase understanding of how the changes could affect immigration status. We stepped up our community outreach to ensure immigrant survivors know how to access our legal services. Another challenge was to stop a bill which would have created a domestic violence registry and unintentionally placed victims in greater danger. Thanks to our network of member programs and volunteers, we educated policy makers and kept the bill from passing. These are great examples of how the Coalition effectively addresses the challenges facing survivors through community education, direct services, and public policy advocacy.

GRATEFUL. I am incredibly grateful for the outpouring of kindness and generosity from our volunteers, allies, and supporters. Without you, we could not do this work. It is my great privilege to work along side so many passionate, like-minded people as we change the culture of violence and create communities where all women, children and men are safe and valued. Together we are making a difference.
