Workshop Presentations

This year we are asking that all workshops have a particular emphasis on the various intersections of prevention work. There will be a preference for proposals that engage participants through a workshop style versus lecture style presentations. Workshop proposals should be prevention centered, trauma informed, and include culturally competent approaches. We accept proposals that cover a wide variety of issues regarding prevention of violence, but proposals which address the following topics are encouraged:

- Bystander Intervention
- Strategies for Engaging Men as Allies
- Strangulation

- The Intersection of SA Prevention and Other Health Issues
- Preventing Violence on Campus & Title IX
- Identifying and Addressing Gaps in Services
- Prevention Techniques for Rural, High Risk, and Minority Communities
- Reproductive Coercion
- Sexual Assault Crime & Investigation
- Community Mobilization

Guidelines

1. Proposed Keynote workshops should fit into a 75 (60 minutes of instruction and 15 minutes of Q&A) minute time-frame.

Proposed General workshops should fit into a 60 (45 minutes of instruction and 15 minutes of Q&A) minute timeframe.

This should include time for introductions and evaluations. Workshops should align with the theme of creativity and emerging trends.

- 2. We estimate 30-50 participants per workshop.
- 3. We expect workshops to be focused around skill building and audience engagement, with minimal reliance on lecture style format.
- 4. Workshops should include at least 3 practical take aways for attendees.
- 5. TN Coalition reserves the right to edit titles and workshop descriptions for content and space.
